LETTER FROM PASTOR LEIGH

Hello Dear Friends,

I pray that you know and experience grace and peace in the name of Jesus Christ, whose certain resurrection we will celebrate at the end of this month. In fact, on the very last day of the month of March.

It is comforting to know that some things are certain. Spring will come, even during cold winter days. The sun will surely rise in the morning. Christmas is always on December 25. Certainty gives us a sense of comfort and calm.

But, what about uncertainty? Unlike Christmas, Easter moves around. It is celebrated after the first full moon that occurs on or following the spring equinox on March 21. It's no wonder that we ask ourselves, when is Easter this year. It can occur anytime within a thirty-five-day period, depending on the phases of the moon. The season of Lent begs us to consider the uncertainty of life, because it is itself, uncertain.

This year our world is filled with so much uncertainty:

An ongoing war in Ukraine.

A war that has raged for over six-months in Israel.

An election whose outcome is unknown.

Of course, the church deficit is just one symptom of the larger challenge we have all faced as we have emerged from a COVID quarantine into living with the uncertainty of the disease and its many variants. We are vigilant keeping windows and air purifiers working. We sometimes wear masks. We keep a healthy distance from one another. We get vaccinated. We are a community of love that works to protect our friends from an uncertain illness. In year 5 of the pandemic, we are still mindful of the ramifications of a new outbreak.

However, we always live with the unknown. Recent studies show that we benefit from uncertainty. Not me, you might say! Yet the more we face uncertainty, the more we become adaptive experts who break the inertia of predictability. We replace anxiety with curiosity. We can see more in a situation that previously might have elicited despair or worry. Embracing uncertainty can help us be more aware and inquisitive. It helps us to grow.

So, friends, come join me in the space of wondering about uncertainty aloud. A place where friends listen and care for one another when the unknown is before us. Always remembering that God is with us, we are not alone. Not ever.

Adult Formation Classes


