## **LETTER FROM PASTOR LEIGH**

*“Keep my steps steady according to your promise,  
and never let iniquity have dominion over me.”*

Psalm 119: 133 (NRSV)

*“Loosen, empty, push.”*

Hello All!

May the blessings of the Easter Season be upon you and your loved ones.

One of my colleagues practices Tai Chi, and I have been privileged to join him in several sessions over the past two years. It is a wonderful form of meditation with some significant health benefits. Specifically, this discipline develops flexibility, balance, strength, and heart health. Using the three-step mantra “Loosen, empty, push,” practitioners of Tai Chi develop a greater awareness of themselves and the ways in which they move through various spaces in their lives.

At the end of this month, I will be moving through the space of the General Conference of The United Methodist Church in Charlotte, North Carolina. The Conference lasts twelve days, and we will consider **over 1,000 petitions and resolutions**, all of which will impact The United Methodist denomination, as well as our local church, and consist of multiple topics and intersectional issues that we all care about deeply.

Generally, there are three primary **Legislative Priorities (the 3 Rs)**:

1. **Regionalization.** The proposal would create eight distinct regional governing bodies in what are currently the seven central conferences in Africa, Europe, the Philippines as well as in the United States. Each region would have the same authority to adapt portions of the Book of Discipline, the denomination’s policy book, to their missional context. Worldwide regionalization requires amending the denomination’s constitution. For ratification, an amendment must receive at least a two-thirds vote at General Conference and at least a two-thirds total vote at annual conferences, bodies consisting of lay and clergy voters from multiple congregations. Most other legislation requires a simple majority.
2. **Revised Social Principles.** Multiple petitions submitted by the United Methodist Board of Church and Society that revise the denomination’s social witness. The proposals are the result of an eight-year revision process prompted by the 2012 General Conference to make the denomination’s social teachings “more globally relevant, theologically founded and succinct.” More than 4,000 United Methodists from around the globe have contributed to the revisions. As proposed, the revision would no longer refer to homosexuality at all. Since 1972, the Social Principles have stated that “the practice of homosexuality... is incompatible with Christian teaching.”
3. **Removal of the Discriminatory language against LGBTQ people.** Since General Conference added the Social Principle on homosexuality in 1972, subsequent gatherings have added bans on “self-avowed practicing” gay clergy and the officiation of same-sex weddings. Also since 1972, every General Conference has been marked by hurtful debate over the place of LGBTQ people in church life. The clashes came to a head at the special 2019 General Conference, which passed the Traditional Plan that attempted to strengthen enforcement of the bans and opened the door for the church disaffiliations seen over the past four years. The removal of the harmful language would return the Book of Discipline to its original form from 1784 to 1972.

This will be my fourth, and potentially the most significant, General Conference I have attended in the last twelve years. Because the legislation is so vast, delegations break down the resolutions, assigning delegates and alternates to one of 15 committees. I have always worked on Church and Society (social justice) legislation and this conference will be no different.

General Conference is not an experience for the weak of heart, so I suspect that my Tai Chi training will be helpful.

“Loosen” as we delegates have been preparing by reading and analyzing legislation.

“Emptying” as the 862 delegates discuss and debate the legislation in committee rooms, then bring it onto the floor for more debate.

“Push” as together we vote for the future of The United Methodist Church.

Exercising the flexibility, balance, strength, and heart health of Tai Chi, I pray the twelve days of General Conference will be a time of reawakening, renewing, and resurrecting the Church I love.

Please pray for all 862 of us at General Conference as we practice flexibility, balance, strength, and love from April 22 to May 3.

Join us at the place of hope and renewal at 10 am every Sunday morning.



### **Discussion By Sudbury Police Chief Scott Nix on “Safety Preparedness” at 11:15 am on Sunday April 21**


